The Sitbons allege that the Verdiers breached a lawful purchase and sale contract. The court in SXM is to render its verdict tomorrow (Tuesday) -- in Dutch. As soon as we're told what it says by people close to the case, we'll pass that info along to our JMB Website Supporters members in a special bulletin. 8. Up-To-Date Report On The Zika Virus: A Case of Mistaken Identity?

The aedes agypti mosquito is not a nice bug. Black with white racing stripe-like markings, that mosquito carries dengue fever, Chikungunya, Zika, and other maladies *if and only if* it bites a person infected with any of those diseases.

During a conversation with a writer/reporter in SXM early during the Regatta, it became clear that we all do not necessarily know what is going on with Zika.

The writer, who is well known and well respected in SXM, said some scientists are openly doubting that the Zika virus has anything to do with microcephaly, the purported Zika-caused birth defect that causes children to be born with small brains and to die months after birth. The reporter told us that in Brazil, where microcephaly is occurring, authorities are spraying insecticide everywhere, apparently including reservoirs. They say a number of pregnant women drinking water from those reservoirs are having children born with microcephaly. They add, she said, that the insecticide is causing the birth defects, not the otherwise mild and transitory Zika virus.

There was no info about the Guillain Barre syndrome, a serious autoimmune disorder that some people are saying may somehow also be linked to Zika in Brazil. More on that is here: http://www.ninds.nih.gov/disorders/gbs/detail_gbs.htm

The question is whether Zika is a mild disease which is symptomless in a majority of cases and has no side effects, or whether it can cause microcephaly and/or Guillain Barre. Many who thought they knew the answer are now not so sure.

9. Heineken Regatta Results & Pictures

Although about 200 sailboats in many categories participated in this year's Heineken Regatta, one stood head and shoulders above the others for its revolutionary design and its record-breaking performance.

On Friday, the 70-foot-long carbon-composite triple-hull Phaedo "gunboat" flew around the island in an hour and 19 minutes, beating the 1:29 record it had set last year. Its huge sails often propel it along at speeds in excess of 40 kts and it is frequently seen with only part of a single hull touching the water. It is the most fascinating piece of sailing engineering and ingenuity we've ever seen.

11. Where Should You Buy Cheese?

As a half-French, half-Dutch island, SXM offers many of the cheeses you'd find in France or Holland. Carrefour in Cole Bay has a good selection in its house "Carrefour" brand and good prices as well. Both Simply Markets, in Marigot and Orient near the road to Pinel, have a large selection.

But once again Super U seems to us to have the best selection. Super U is a relatively new market next to McDonalds in Marigot. Great prices, fresh stock, good service, but slow register lines much of the time. Not big but very busy.

12. SXM In Serious Need of Hospitality Training

As SXM Rotary pointed out in a campaign a few years ago, tourism in SXM is everybody's business. The SXM economy revolves around tourism. That's why SXM schools should teach hospitality to all students -- starting with the basics like please, thank you, and brisk response to consumers.

Beyond that, job training is essential. Businesses need standard operating procedures which are strict and unwavering and which are strongly enforced for consistency. The best businesses do this -- top restaurants are a great example. Watch most employees at Spiga, IZI, Pineapple Pete, Sushiitto, SkipJack's, Toppers, Mario's Bistro, Daniel's By The Sea / Busby's, Cugini, and Vesna Taverna (among others) and you see people in constant motion getting things done.

It leaves a lasting impression that helps bring back tourists. Smiles are a big deal, too....

13. FIG Restaurant Getting High Marks At Its New Location

"FIG" - Randy Attin's excellent restaurant which relocated to the second floor of La Terrasse where Charolais used to be (in Maho) -- is getting rave reviews from just about everyone who visits.

The food at FIG has always been excellent, but now parking is easier (there's an underground garage in the building), service has been kicked up a notch, and the setting has been entirely renovated and is modern and beautiful.

If you haven't tried FIG lately, do it; you won't be disappointed. "FIG" is an acronym for Food Is Good and it certainly is at FIG.

14. Restaurant of the Week: SkipJacks

SkipJacks is a bit deceiving when you first look at it. A long hallway takes you to the dining area but first, you pass by their little fish market which has a good selection of local and some cold water fish. You'll also pass their lobster tanks with spiny Caribbean lobster plus cold water lobster flown in fresh from North Atlantic waters. Spiny lobster prices are very reasonable compared to many other quality restaurants -- and it's Saba lobster, too, the best.

The dining room is huge, with both elevated seating and seaside seats offering a great view of megayachts moored in the lagoon.

But the home runs start getting hit, one after another, as soon as you sit down. Kelvin, our waiter, had been with Pineapple Pete before; both restaurants have great waitstaffs that know exactly what to do and when to do it -- and they *move*.

The night we visited, about 10 days before Regatta, the place was packed. We later heard that night totalled 225 dinners, an average night for SkipJacks. Many ordered lobster -- there were lots of them in the lobster pool. Others, me included, ordered fish and chips because here they use Cod, just like in Boston (not mahi). Their crab cakes are also outstanding and have practically no salt, a good thing. No MSG, either.

They're also renowned for their steaks and we'll try one when we go back in a week or two. All in all, SkipJacks is an outstanding restaurant. Owner George Shetter knows his stuff and this place shows it. Great staff. Great food. Great location. Just go... for us it was a wonderful experience and we'll be back.

15. Best Places To Try Journey "Johnny" Cakes on SXM

If you Google or Wikipedia Johnny Cakes, you'll see they have a worldwide following. But their preparation and use can be far different.

Produced in Rhode Island, Kenyon's Corn Meal, made in a grist mill that is over 250 years old, created Rhode Island's signature "johnnycakes" which are like corn meal pancakes, sweet, delicious, and served with maple syrup. They're also cooked like pancakes.

In the Caribbean, "Journey Cakes" were the original of a very different concoction intended to be used by travelers -hence "journey." You can see exactly how they're usually made in this video that we produced several years ago: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XurYtUpZI20</u>

Not all Caribbean Johnny Cakes are made that way.

At **Mr. Busby's Beach Bar** you can order practically any sandwich on homemade Johnnycakes -- even breakfast or lunch sandwiches, and they are really good. A link to the Mr. Busby's website is in the previous article.

Johney Burger's in the departure lounge at SXM Airport uses great tasting Johney Cakes that are baked, not fried. Their burgers are fantastic, named for different geographical areas on the island. Definitely try them at the end of your next SXM vacation.

16. St. Maarten's Own: Buy DAS Cigars

If you like really good cigars, you owe it to yourself to try DAS cigars when you're next in SXM. With tobacco grown from Cuban seeds in the fertile soils and ideal climate of the Dominican Republic, these cigars are all slowly handcrafted in SXM using custom-grown wrappers from Connecticut and elsewhere. They are a St. Maarten company that soon expects to have US and Canadian distribution (it's being established now). In the meantime, ask for it by name at better Cigar shops across the island.

From a culinary perspective, Porto Cupecoy has really come of age.

Although there have been a number of restaurants here for years, only now is real excellence showing up. A few weeks go, and also a few months ago, we featured "Mario Bistro" at its new Porto Cupecoy location, to which it moved well before high season. And we'll soon be visiting and telling you about Shanghai Brasserie, across the plaza from Mario...

Mario's former restaurant in Marigot had seen better days. The food was as spectacular as it had always been but the neighborhood had declined and the building owner wasn't doing the best possible job of building maintenance. So Mario made the big move to Porto Cupecoy, where the building is new and gorgeous and the dining is spectacular. Mario is in the kitchen making sure everything comes out just as you expect and he's doing a marvelous job according to virtually all who visit, including us. We love it. Go... it's clearly one of SXM's best.

Also check out Shanghai Brasserie under Elisa Cohen with some start-up energy from long-time culinary entrepreneur Jim Goldman. It has a large menu, great food, and a very authentic ambiance like the best of the best. We'll be going soon as well.

Rendezvous Cafe and Ernest & Fidel's round out the restaurants at Porto Cupecoy. Visit soon...

Both of them believe in charging reasonable prices and they do exactly that.

Both deliver plenty of food and have truly attentive service. Their staff people know what they're doing.

Both offer fresh and delicious lobster. Try both for a variety of different cooking approaches; great stuff and you'll love the research. (Both Daniels by the Sea and SkipJack's also offer lobster and sell a lot of it.)

Both offer lots of choices. When you're hungry, just go. You will not be disappointed. Nothing pretentious here, just truly excellent food and plenty of it. You'll also see that both restaurants are repeat recipients of our Everything St. Maarten Award of Excellence which is proudly displayed in each restaurant. Go... great stuff.

20. Want To Meet Gendarmes? Here Are Three Sure-Fire Suggestions

On the French Side there are three easy ways to meet gendarmes, the pumped police who are actually members of the French military. The bad news is that these methods will cost you.

a) Drive after having several drinks. French Side drunk driving laws are very very strict and at the very least you will be pulled over and heavily fined by gendarmes. Drive around carelessly and you're sure to wind up in jail as well.

b) Do not wear, and do not have any of your passengers wear seat belts. The fine is about \$200 per person per offense, payable in cash. This is best accomplished in the daytime on the waterfront in Marigot. Wave at the gendarmes to make sure they see you. Do not be surprised if they approach with automatic weapons.

c) If you see gendarmes while driving, put your cellphone up to your ear and toot your horn to be sure the gendarmes see that you're violating the French Side ban on driving / talking on your cell phone while driving.

Of course, if you're drunk, driving with no seat belt, and talking on your cell phone while driving drunk belt-less, you'll likely hit the jackpot and meet lots of gendarmes who may even require you to stay over in jail.

All of these are remarkably bad ideas and we do not recommend them at all....

21. Avoid Pic Paradis

If you want to visit the Loterie Farm nature park, do it; it's great from top to bottom. Zip lines, natural food emporium, hikes, pool, lots more. Monkeys too, sometimes. And the view from the top of the zipline trail is tremendous.

But we urge you not to drive or hike to the top of Pic Paradis (Paradise Peak), the highest elevation on the island. The road is a terrible mess and police don't patrol it. For years it has been the site of numerous holdups and thefts from cars, locked or not. Just stay away from the peak.

22. Have You Met Mervin The Wild Monkey Yet?

On this trip we've seen dozens and dozens of iguanas (we've told you before where to find them), probably half a dozen mongoose, mostly in Oyster Pond, and three wild vervet monkeys -- one in the Orient Beach area across the street from the Cadisco gas station and two ambling across the road near the downhill entrance to Oyster Bay Beach Resort in Dawn Beach. The latter two were both near the electrical junction box on Oyster Pond Road near Emerald Merritt Road and they may have been the same large monkey, who we've named Mervin....

Don't believe there are wild monkeys in SXM? There are estimates of up to 2000 of them. They like private homes with fruit trees and nuts. (Iguanas like private homes with vegetable gardens.)

23. Iguana Soup

A few years ago, we saw a car hit an iguana in SXM in Sandy Ground. The driver stopped and picked up the injured animal. Good, we thought; he'll bring it to a vet and....

When we told two locals about that both laughed... and both said "iguana soup."

Far from being just a Jimmy Buffett classic, iguana soup is a culinary tradition in the Caribbean, though we don't recall seeing it on any SXM menus. We've not tasted it but we've been told it's very appealing.

We heard the same about ox tail soup but we have no plan to try that, either.
