1. Hurricane Gonzalo Hits SXM (Our Original Story, Written Monday Morning)

[There's an interesting contrast between this story, written early Monday, and the lead story in Section 3, written after the storm swirled northwest. As you'll see when you read the latter, a lot changed in a few hours.-Ed.]

Just days after many meteorologists had said that the Cape Verde hurricane season had ended rather uneventfully, the tropical Atlantic heated up and today, a strong tropical storm named Gonzalo is hitting the island. In fact, a hurricane watch was issued since the storm is very close to hurricane strength as of this writing, shortly after noon on Monday.

The government issued a stream of news releases during the morning closing schools and advising businesses to close by noon because of strong winds and heavy rain expected. Schools were closed for the day and the post office department was to be shut down shortly after noon.

Some electricity interruption should be expected during the storm on both sides of the island, and flight interruptions at Princess Juliana international Airport are highly likely.

St. Maarten's buildings and its infrastructure are geared for hurricanes, which can be part of life on the island every fall. Gonzalo is to the south

of St. Maarten moving West to Northwest and is expected to head for the US Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico. Unless a storm intensifies far beyond current expectations, the storms potential 80 mile-per-hour gusts and heavy rains are expected to cause nothing other than minor wind damage and some street flooding.

2. Could Two Storms Affect SXM?

Although there is currently tropical activity in the Atlantic, St. Martin's main focus today is on Gonzalo.

However, between the island and the Cape Verde islands, there is another tropical disturbance which is trying to get its act together. It's having a difficult time in the National Hurricane Center does not expect anything significant to happen in the next few days.

3. Southwest to Fly to Caribbean from Houston Hobby as Well as BWI

When Southwest Airlines merged with AirTran, it was clear that Southwest would be expanding internationally since AirTran already flew outside the US.

We previously reported that Southwest would be flying to the Caribbean from BWI Airport. Now, Southwest has announced that it will also be flying to Caribbean and South American destinations from its new terminal at Houston Hobby Airport. That was sooner than expected.

What does this mean for Southwest flights to St. Maarten? Nobody knows and the airline isn't saying, but it wouldn't surprise us to see Southwest flights landing at Princess Juliana airport from BWI within the next year. As always, SXM Weekly News will keep you posted.

6. Caravanserai / Alegria Situation Worsens as RCI Exchanges End (Into or Out of The Resort)

The previous edition of St. Maarten Weekly News was a Caravanseral special edition which covered the emerging situation at the Alegria timeshare resort, formerly Caravanserai.

A number of owners, but not all, have received an e-mail saying that their timeshare contracts are null and void. We published the e-mail and the attachment here last week, here: http://everythingsxm.com/sxm/free_newsletters/sxmweeklynews.shtml

Although efforts are underway on the island to solve this, in the short term things became more difficult for timeshare owners in the last few days.

First, the new owners say they do not want a timeshare resort -- they want a hotel w/ timeshare-like condominiums inside. Alegria discontinued the relationship that Caravanserai had with RCI, Resort Condominiums International. Therefore, any future trades that were made by Caravanserai timeshare owners with other resorts through RCI are, from everything we've seen, void. If you had any such trades arranged, you should call RCI at once.

Second, since Alegria is not a member of RCI, it will not honor any reservations made through RCI for trades into the resort. In fact, guests who had traded into Caravanserai and who were there when the takeover occurred were in their words "thrown out" -- relocated to other resorts. principally St. Maarten Sea Palace on Front Street, Philipsburg, a very nice place on the beach, recently upgraded.

7. SMTA Timeshare Association Involved in Meetings to Fix Caravanserai Mess

The SMTA, the St. Maarten Timeshare Association, has stepped into the Caravanseral debacle as an advocate for timeshare owners.

We spoke at length with SMTA secretary Jim Rosen, who has held that position for a number of years. He believes that negotiations between the SMTA, the new ownership of Alegria, and members of the new government on the Dutch side should help to produce an agreement which is satisfactory to all. Others are less sanguine about the possibility. There is no question that members of government and practically everyone else thinks that the move by Alegria is anticonsumer, anti-tourist, etc. It does nothing toward what should be Alegria's initial objective, which should be to cement its relationships with its inherited timeshare owners.

Hopefully this situation can be solved amicably without further injury to any of the parties concerned. If not, it will wind up in court, which will cost timeshare owners money and will damage Alegria's ability to succeed in SXM. We hope that calm heads prevail and that this problem is solved quickly to the benefit of all concerned. We know that's possible.

8. Best Condo Resorts on SXM

Because of all the issues at Caravanserai / Alegria, we decided to do some best-of articles in case Alegria owners and others who were planning to trade into Alegria decide to go elsewhere.

We're going to exclude Alegria from this listing because of the issues there. Not all of the units in the resorts we're mentioning here are condos; some are hotel rooms. We are also going to include as condos some units which are suites and which contain everything you would need to live there long-term, were you in the market to do so (stove, refrigerator, etc.)

The first resort we'll list here is the Princess Heights boutique resort in Dawn beach, which you will find also listed in our story about luxury resorts. Many units are condominium units — and all of their units consistently get high grades from visitors, renters, and owners. Highly recommended.

We are not listing these in any special order by the way.

Second on our list is Oyster Bay Beach Resort on Dawn beach, which may well be the best timeshare on the island. It is adjacent to the northern end of Dawn beach, near some very fine restaurants and pizza emporiums, and keeps getting great reviews from its timeshare owners. On the other hand, don't expect availability to be great --particularly in high season.

Third, check out Baker's Suites in Simpson Bay. New from the ground up only a year ago, it is beautifully appointed, very well-managed, immaculate, in every room has a full refrigerator and stove. Its location in the heart of Simpson Bay means it's close to many outstanding restaurants and many island beaches, as well as to the airport.

Fourth, check out the newest section of Simpson Bay Resort, open several years ago. Serious upgrades and now being made resort-wide, and if the unit you are renting is not in the newest building, it may still be outstanding.

Fifth, check out Mary's Boon Beach Plantation which has undergone a renaissance with owners Mark and Karla Cleveland. It is guickly being restored to the excellence it knew for many years — and its location on Simpson Bay beach this guite beautiful.

Sixth, although almost all the units are efficiencies, Summit Resort Hotel in Cupecoy offers free Internet, widescreen TVs, fantastic views, and a staff that truly knows its stuff.

Seventh, Divi little Bay is another timeshare property that gets rave reviews from its owners, as does Royal Islander near the airport – so we recommend both.

Eighth, La Vista and La Vista Beach are beautiful, tranquil spots in a small, very well managed resort. Great little restaurant, too.

Ninth and last, Hotel L'Esplanade in Grand Case cannot be beat. It is gorgeous inside and out, extremely well-managed, and reasonably priced — and the euro to dollar ratio is easier to take now than it has been in years. Highly recommended.

9. Best Large Hotels on SXM

Some of the hotels listed above also fit into this category. There's also the question about much money you want to spend. If money is no object, then you may very well want to splurge for La Samanna, which is widely regarded as the finest resort on the island and the one most likely to be visited by the rich and famous. Nothing is spared here — the food is extraordinary, the accommodations sublime, and the beach immaculate. Service is impeccable. Of course, you pay for it; but if that's not a big deal, this is your place.

The Westin St. Maarten resort and casino, located at the southern end of Dawn beach, is another large, outstanding property.

Featuring many restaurants, a casino just off the lobby, and a few shops, the Westin is probably the best of the name-brand hotels on the island. Since it is largely self-contained, you don't necessarily need a car, but we always recommend one – you will not want to forgo the outstanding restaurants both in the Dawn beach area and beyond. And, of course, the beaches.

You should also consider Princess Heights, Divi little Bay, Oyster Bay beach resort, L'Esplanade, and some of the larger timeshares mentioned in the previous article.

10. Best Suites Hotels on SXM

Some of the condo properties we mentioned in one of the previous articles in this section will be suitable for people seeking suites hotels — but if it's a pure suites Hotel you're looking for, there are really only two:

First, the Princess Heights property, mentioned earlier, is perched high on a hill overlooking Dawn beach and the tropical Atlantic, with St. Barths on the horizon. Bring binoculars, and you'll be able to see cruise ships in the harbor of St. Barths, and watch high-speed ferries with passengers from one of the marinas in oyster pond travel to Gustavia. We highly recommend Princess Heights. When you visit, please say hello to Emil Lee for us – he's the chief honcho.

Second, do check out Baker's Suites in Simpson Bay. It opened less than a year ago and is completely new from the ground up, as we also noted above. Outstanding property — and it's in the middle of one of the most vibrant areas in the island.

11. Best Luxury Hotels on SXM

There are truly two: first, La Samanna, mentioned in story nine; and, second, Princess Heights, mentioned in story 10 and previously. Check them out.

11a. Hurricane Gonzalo Lashes SXM, Causing Widespread Damage; The Full Story

As dawn broke on Monday morning, St. Maarten wasn't expecting much of a storm. A tropical storm was coming, forecasters said, and would bring winds of perhaps 50 to 60 mi./h, heavy rains, and rough surf. The island has been through this kind of stuff many times in the past, and it was minor compared to some of the big ones -- Luis Lenny, etc.

But by late morning, it was becoming obvious that hurricane Gonzalo had other ideas. As the storm churned northwestward by Guadeloupe, warm Caribbean waters energized it and it intensified, becoming a hurricane early in the afternoon. It continued to gain strength through the afternoon.

The Dutch side government had canceled school first thing in the morning but by late morning, government workers were told they were going to be dismissed and businesses were urged to close after noon. The wind grew more intense, the ocean became very rough, and heavy showers turned into deluges.

Power went out last night over much of the island and is starting to be restored today. Trees were down everywhere as were signs, and there was guite a lot of flooding on streets across the island. Many homeowners reported flooding inside their homes by torrential wind driven rains. At least one home saw its roof blow away and there was one report today (Tuesday) of a fatality.

Boat owners were hammered in the storm. Many dozens of boats tore loose from their moorings in Marigot, oyster pond, and Simpson Bay lagoon. A large boat near Boca Marina tore loose are obliterated Neil Roebert's Celine catamaran, for years an island favorite for Tintamarre trips, our Sunday members-only sunset cruises, and pub crawls. It was largely reduced to rubble.

The Butterfly Farm was essentially blown away, and the St. Maarten Zoo sustained heavy damage. An animal shelter lost its roof.

Orient beach was especially hard-hit, with a number of structures sustaining heavy damage.

Although there were no early dollar estimates of the extent of the damage, it will easily be millions of dollars.

12. Theo Heyliger To Be Next Dutch Side Prime Minister; Sarah Wescot-Williams is President of Parliament; Gov't. Likely To Be More Tourist Oriented

Theo Heyliger, grandson of Dr. Claude Wathey, a near legendary figure in St. Maarten politics, is poised to take over as the island's new Prime Minister within the next week or so.

The new government under Mr. Heyliger, including Sarah Wescot-Williams of the Democratic Party as President of Parliament, will have a Heyligeresque UP-party flavor to it and give Mr. Heyliger the ability for the first time as head of government to pursue a strongly jobs and tourist oriented agenda.

Because of Theo's extensive involvement for many years in tourist oriented projects, it's reasonable to expect that his administration will be highly focused on improving the product St. Maarten offers to tourists in every practical respect.

The kind of consumer protection afforded in the United States is not in the culture of St. Maarten or of the Netherlands. Nonetheless, it is guite reasonable to expect progress in consumer protection since that is expected by consumers and is needed to keep the product in high demand.

We'll watch this closely as always, and keep you well-informed.

13. GEBE: Short Circuit Causes Big Dutch Side Blackout

Toward the end of last week, GEBE, the Dutch side electric and water company, had a problem that resulted in a blackout across the entire Dutch side. It lasted several hours. Many people staying in hotels never knew it happened since most hotels have emergency generators.

Roughly a day after the blackout, GEBE said the problem was caused by a short circuit. It never said what caused the short circuit or how it would prevent a recurrence.

Despite the fact that this gave the utility a black eye, their service has been better in recent years.

We'll keep you posted.

14. Dutch Side, French Side in Tug of War Over Captain Oliver's

Capt. Olivers restaurant and Marina in oyster pond has been operating for decades under licenses granted by the Dutch side, where it is located. Suddenly, the French side seems to disagree, as some French side officials apparently came into the establishment and started poking around. Capt. Olivers justifiably takes offense at this and it appears that lawyers are about to get involved.

The restaurant is quite close to the border between the Dutch and French Sides and we don't think anything will happen with this, but you never know so we'll keep an eye on it.

15. On Orient Beach, It's Erosion, Seaweed, and Jellyfish - Complicated by Gonzalo (See story #11a)

Orient beach is arguably the most popular tourist destination on the island. It's topless in its entirety and its southern and is taken up by Club Orient, the largest and probably the most famous naturist resort in the Caribbean.

But now, one would expect only for a brief time, Orient beach has a few issues.

First, it has suffered a fair amount of seasonal erosion. It's not at all unusual, and in fact it seems to happen in late summer and early fall almost on an annual basis. Normally the eroded beach gradually replaces itself as winter begins.

Second, we told you about the Sargasso seaweed affecting the Eastern shore of the island. Orient beach is on the eastern shore, so it has been affected. The seaweed is being carefully removed.

Third, there are jellyfish in the water. This problem usually disappears by winter as well, and this year should be no exception.

Hurricane Gonzalo pummeled Orient as you've seen in pictures we posted at https://www.facebook.com/jeff.berger1. Erosion as noted here was made much worse by the storm.

We'll keep you posted on recovery.

16. "Island Paradise" SXM Series Debuts on Travel Channel; Dino, Jennifer Featured

Many of the island's busiest restaurants offer of full Thanksgiving day feast, just like you'd find in the US. There are two reasons: first, a number of restaurants here are owned by Americans, and second, Americans are a majority of island tourists and on Thanksgiving, they want turkey.

Probably the three most popular spots for Thanksgiving dining are Toppers and Toppers by the Sea; Pineapple Pete; and Jimbo's. If you plan to be on St. Maarten for Thanksgiving, it would be a very wise idea for you to make early reservations since all these places tend to sell out. Wait a few days though -- phone service and electricity are being restored.

For years, when an ambulance or fire apparatus was required in the Simpson Bay area, it had to come from the Philipsburg vicinity. That costs valuable time and was the source of concern for people not only in Simpson Bay, but also in Maho and Cupecoy.

The government is addressing this and will soon station an ambulance and fire apparatus at the Princess Juliana airport specifically for use in calls to Simpson Bay and Cupecoy — for the first time. That's excellent news that at some point is bound to save lives.

21. Where to Get an All-Over Tan on St. Maarten / St. Martin

There are many places, most of them described in detail on the beaches page of www.everythingStMaarten.com .

Here, we'll simply mentioned two:

First, Cupecoy beach on the Dutch side near the French border. Cupecoy is actually the string of beaches to the west of Mullet Bay beach. Only the westernmost beaches, those near the Shore Pointe condominiums and the adjacent beaches are clothing optional by tradition. Dany and John rent chairs here and also provide food, drink, and make sure there are no "Cliff boy" gawkers.
