2. Use Our Guidelines for the Lowest Airfares to SXM

Recent fares have been a bit lower than those posted from some cities, but the trend is for fares to rise despite low jet fuel costs. Airlines are keeping a tight rein on capacity and demand remains high, which is what is causing fares to increase.

3. Make Winter Cruise Reservations Before Prices Increase

We don't know the extent of the ship repositioning yet, but we do know that ships will be repositioned and capacity will fall, which means prices are going up.

5. Caravanserai Battle Will Be Long; Never Assume Anything

A number of Caravanserai owners seem to have assumed already that the war has been lost. That is not the case, and in fact only one case has been heard in court and more are inevitable.

For those of you who have just joined us, the previous owner of Caravanserai went belly up. The resort was bought at auction from the Bank of Nova Scotia for \$14 million by individuals who have since renamed it Alegria. The principal owner is Ray Sidhom, who you can Google.

Widely spread rumors say that some of the current buildings will be bulldozed and replaced with an upscale hotel property with all the amenities. We've attempted to contact Mr. Sidhom but he has not responded. We know the owners don't want a timeshare operation, so one of their first actions was to send e-mails to some timeshare owners in October telling them that their timeshare contracts were null and void, and if they wanted to stay in the resort in a hotel unit they could do so by paying the new owners an amount equivalent to their most recent annual maintenance fee.

Many owners never received that e-mail. Worse, to the best of our knowledge, no other follow-up mailing was never done, which means that many timeshare owners have no idea their units may not be available. In fact, the e-mail sent by the resort said there was a deadline of November 1 to sign a paper relinquishing timeshare owner rights and requesting a hotel unit.

Later, it became clear that the property intended to give those who agreed to this their own unit – though it never said that in writing to anyone. And it was dead serious about discontinuing timesharing, which means timeshare owner investments would be worthless, untradable, and unsellable.

We quickly set up a Caravanserai timeshare page on Facebook: https://www.facebook.com/Caravanseraitimeshare

More than 250 Caravanserai timeshare owners use that page to talk about the situation and what to do next. Indeed, some have grouped together and are pursuing things legally.

Overall, timeshare owners are not happy with the island government's response to the situation. However, it's important to remember that an election was held last September and thanks to Dutch politicians getting involved in St. Maarten's business, the new government still is not in office -- so it can't act. But in the minds of timeshare owners, the island had years to enact real timeshare owner consumer protection and it failed to do so -- so timeshare owner anger is focused on the government for not protecting them. Many have lost tens of thousands of dollars and have said they will not return to SXM.

The first court action attempted to institute an injunction to stop Alegria, the new name of the resort, from expropriating timeshare weeks, but the court held that the litigants did not prove their case and said Alegria did not have to honor prior timeshare owner contracts.

If you are Caravanserai timeshare owner, you can apparently still call the resort and reserve your week for this season in your unit. We also suggest you consider getting involved in any legal action against the resort, if after reviewing things you think you should do so. Information about all that is on the above Facebook page. (Facebook is free.)

As noted above, some people have said they will never go to St. Maarten again because of this. Our opinion is that that constitutes throwing the baby out with the bathwater; it punishes honest business who had nothing to do with buying Caravanserai or making these changes. And we can tell you business owners are very unhappy with this situation and there is a lot of beyond-the-scenes activity from them

regarding this: they are trying to help.

Bottom line, the delay in installing the new government clearly has not helped, since the current caretaker regime can't really do anything dynamic about the timeshare situation. Despite the fact that prior governments never enacted timeshare owner consumer protection legislation which may have prevented this situation, it is what it is; the government is changing and the situation will be in the courts for a long time to come.

Hang in. This situation is far from over.

6. What Should Caravanserai Timeshare Owners Do?

There are several things timeshare owners stuck in this situation should do.

First, become thoroughly familiar with what has happened and with your options, many of which are explained on the Caravanserai timeshare page on Facebook: https://www.facebook.com/Caravanseraitimeshare

Second, make sure you have all your paperwork accessible.

Third, if you feel you want to be involved in the litigation, contact one of the attorneys mentioned on the above Facebook page. We suggest, however, that you first make contact with some of the other Caravanserai timeshare owners using that same page — share knowledge, share experience, and consider your options.

Fourth, if you have anything you want to say to the island, do so in writing on the letters to the editor pages of the two principal newspapers, the Daily Herald and today. Here is contact information for both:

If you do write to the newspapers or anyone else, please keep your writing factual and to the point. Emotional approaches or name-calling don't work in St. Maarten. Facts will help your case. The objective is to solve this problem.

7. Delay in Installation of New Government Not Helping Timeshare Owners

As noted above, St. Maarten timeshare owners' fortunes have been buffeted by the in-process change in government underway on the Dutch side.

Although a government does exist, it is a caretaker holdover from the prior administration and is unable to do much on its own. Installation of the new government should take place sometime after December 16 but, because of the holidays, it's possible the situation will not be fully resolved until a bit later.

None of this helps timeshare owners, but we honestly do expect the new government to understand the severe hit that has been taken not only by Caravanserai's 2300 timeshare owners (representing about 3000 timeshare weeks). Owners are threatened with the loss of their investments which are in aggregate tens of millions of dollars. Of course this also threatens the entire SXM timeshare industry itself which is the major pillar of the St. Maarten stayover tourism economy. This situation must be solved to avert economic disaster for the St. Maarten economy.

8. Should You Buy Timesharing on SXM?

It may be counterintuitive to think that this is a good time to buy timesharing in St. Maarten, considering recent events at Caravanserai.

Whether to buy is a personal decision for each of us – and many people have been walking away from timesharing for a lot of very good reasons. For example, Diamond Resorts, which owns Royal Palm and Flamingo, has been reviled for astronomical annual maintenance fees. Simpson Bay Resort for years was criticized for lack of maintenance, but it is in the middle of a major renovation which is being given rave reviews by the the vast majority of timeshare owners who stuck with it. There have been some changes at Sapphire Resort but it has yet to be sold to a new developer, and many people believe that's the only step that can make that resort turn the corner permanently — though it has made many positive changes recently.

A big factor in favor of buying now is the fact that prices really have never been lower. A largely aging timeshare owner base wants to divest itself of thousands of timeshare weeks and it often offers them for literally pennies on the dollar – a small fraction of what was paid for the units. Given the likely renovations at many resorts, and the certainty of the renovation program at Simpson Bay Resort, it appears that the investment may well be a good one.

11. In SXM, All Beaches Are Free and Public -- Aren't They?

On December 1, we were riding through the Bel Air area when we noticed that the iron gate at the entrance to the dirt road to Bel Air beach (the beach, not the hotel) had been closed and locked that No Trespassing and Keep Out signs were posted there. We immediately took a picture with our cell phone and posted it on our personal (Jeff Berger) Facebook page. Within hours, the news had bounced from one end of the island to the other and that picture had been shared on Facebook dozens of times.

This wasn't the only recent episode of beaches being blocked from public access. A few weeks ago, a couple attempted to go on Dawn Beach through the Westin and were confronted by hotel guards on the beach who allegedly told them to go elsewhere.

On the French side all beaches are readily accessible to anyone and parking is generally free and easy.

Although the Dutch side says all beaches are free and public, it's often an obstacle course attempting to get onto them easily. After this episode, some people in the Dutch Side government are talking about legislation to codify the availability of beaches to everyone.

In the Bel Air situation, the road is privately owned and development is planned for the property. There are a number of details that don't particularly matter to tourists, but the bottom line is that the padlock has been removed and the signs had been taken down, which means access to Bel Air beach (the beach, not the hotel) is back to being free and easy, like it was before.

We should also note that Little Bay beach at Divi resort is one of the beaches the government regards as being freely available to everyone, yet Divi does want cruise ship people to come and hog "its" beach; it's located on Little Bay.

This situation will be in the news for some time to come. N. B.: Bel Air Resort had no involvement whatsoever in this situation. The land in question is owned by a private developer unaffiliated with the Resort.

12. A Place You Should Not Visit in SXM

During the day, Coralita Road, which stretches from the Dutch/French border at oyster pond along the coast well into French St. Martin, is a gorgeous stretch of road with lots of photo opportunities. Indeed, the scenic overlook at Embouchure is a favorite destination for tourists since it offers beautiful daytime photographic opportunities.

At night, the same stretch of road is desolate, though the gendarmerie now says it is increasing patrols there. In a recent incident, people described by gendarmes as young hooligans threw some rocks at a car occupied by tourists returning to Orient beach from Oyster Pond via that desolate coastal route.

Gendarmes are in the area more now and the likelihood of this occurring again is very small, but nonetheless we avoid that desolate coastal

road at night and we think it would be wise for all tourists to avoid it at night as well. We've never had any daytime issues there.

13. Valuables in SXM: About Your Safety

We've been back on the island for a couple of weeks and we noticed some things that alarm us. They aren't any island problems – things here seem to be outstanding — but they are tourist habits which imply that the tourists who exhibit them think they are in utopia rather than paradise, and there is a huge difference.

We've recently seen many people bring iPads and other valuables to the beach, stuff them in their towels and head off for a walk or and a dip in the Caribbean. In other cases, we've continued to see many people put handbags, computers, video cameras, digital cameras, iPads, and many other valuables in their car trunk and then walk away as if it is a safe. It isn't, and if we see people do these things so do many others, as we've said here repeatedly for years. Please don't do that anywhere.

14. Eclipse, World's 2nd Largest Super Megayacht, is Back; Venus, Steve Jobs' Yacht, Also Here

Eclipse, once the largest super megayacht in the world, has returned to in St. Maarten from its previous port of call, Bermuda. It's owned by one of the world's richest man, Roman Abramovich, a Russian billionaire who also owns the Chelsea football club in the UK.

Venus has also arrived, the super megayacht owned by the family of the late Steve Jobs. Mr. Jobs, the Apple tycoon, had ordered the yacht built but was never able to sail it since he passed away before it was completed.

Other huge mega yachts and super megayachts are said to be headed to the island now.

15. Wine Tasting / Patti Meotti Art Show Coming to Vesna Taverna

16. Should You Drink Bottle or Tap Water in SXM?

GEBE is the Dutch side electric and water company.

For many years we had said it was safe to drink Dutch side water and to get bottled water on the French side — or wine. Technically, as we understand it, the water on both sides of the island now is fine. But since we like good, palatable water, we usually buy bottled water and use it on the island. You don't have to buy expensive stuff -- even inexpensive water here is good. This is just our suggestion – others may disagree. But we're happy with the taste of our choice.

17. Iguanas, Monkeys, Mongoose, and Tarantulas

Wildlife on SXM includes iguanas, monkeys, mongoose, and tarantulas.

Tarantulas?

We had never heard about them being here until after the flooding rains a few weeks ago. In fact, several folks we know who were born here had no idea they were here, either.

The good news is that they eat mosquitoes and cockroaches. Other good news: they tend to hang out on the tops of mountains, and are not big at socializing with tourists. We've never seen one here and doubt we ever will..

Iguanas are as plentiful here as squirrels in New England and like the latter, are often road kill. Although iguanas can run very fast, they

have a bizarre habit of crossing roads really slowly, which down here is a bad idea.

Monkeys are plentiful on St. Maarten but they tend to travel in extended family groups. One estimate we read about a year ago was that there are more than 1200 on the island, a figure which no doubt has increased in the last year. When our daughter visited with us before Christmas of last year in St. Maarten, we took her to Loterie farm where we knew monkeys had been seen. At the entrance, we told her the odds of seeing them were almost nil — then, at the left, we spotted dozens of them feasting on wild fruit.

Mongoose don't hang around people. They look like low-slung, dirty beige, oversized house cats. They're usually gone by the time your camera is out, and in fact it took us many years before we first saw any of them. We've seen them most frequently in the Oyster Pond and Dawn beach areas and in Cupecoy.

18. Seaweed Update

As of Friday, mostly gone everywhere. Still a few scattered patches around, but for the most part this issue seems to be over.

19. Our First Visit to Cugini, Simpson Bay

20. Guilders, Euros, and Dollars - Figuring Them Out

Although dollars are readily accepted across St. Maarten and St. Martin, the national currency of the Dutch side is still the Antillean guilder and the currency of the French side is the euro.

The disparity between the dollar and the euro has been narrowing over the last few months, and today, the euro was worth just under \$1.25. That figure varies depending on world markets. The Antillean guilder is pegged to the US dollar and one dollar is worth 1.78 guilders, although some places put it at 1.80 guilders.

For Americans, the situation is somewhat annoying particularly when you're buying gas which is priced per liter, not gallon. As the price of gas at home continues to drop toward two dollars a gallon, the price here per gallon is more than twice that. The price on the Dutch side always seems to be higher than that on the French side, where some stations charge in euros but accept dollars at par. In our experience, the best station is the Cadisco station near the soccer stadium just north of the French side drawbridge. Look around; you may find something better.

21. Why You Gotta Love SXM's "Wonder Woman"

Laurell is her name, but we prefer to call her what she really is: wonder woman.

On different days, you'll see this lady doing a variety of different duties. Early morning on some days, she's hard at work as the master pastry chef at Pier Grocer, the new and extremely popular small grocery store next to the Greathouse Marina at Oyster Pond on the Dutch side. She makes delicious stuff so if you want any, get there early.

On other days, you'll find her as the chief daytime waitperson at Mr. Busby's Beach Bar, across the street from the grocery store.

And on still other days, Wonder Woman is chief mixologist at Daniel's by the Sea restaurant, the nighttime incarnation of Busby's, though she tends to smile a lot no matter where she is.

Next time you see her, buy all means address her by who she really is, St. Maarten's Wonder Woman.
